- Consumer & Low Impact Fireworks are legal per the Michigan Fireworks Safety Act
- Consumer Fireworks produce visible and/or audible effects, typically launch aurally, & include but are not limited to:
 - Bottle Rockets
 - Mortars
 - Roman Candles
 - Firecrackers
- Low Impact Fireworks typically are ground based & include but are not limited to:
 - Sparklers (hand-held and/or ground based)
- Consumer Fireworks are *illegal* to be used on public property, school property, church property, or property of another person without that organization's or person's express permission.
CONSUMER FIREWORKS MAY NOT BE USED ON ANY CITY OF CADILLAC PROPERTY, INCLUDING PARKS & FIELDS
