WHEREAS, the City of Cadillac ("City") is authorized by statute to buy, own and sell
real property (MCL 117.4e); and
WHEREAS, the Charter of the City provides that the City may, by ordinance and
upon the affirmative vote of four or more members of the Council, sell or exchange any real

WHEREAS, the Charter further provides that before final adoption of such an ordinance, the Council shall hold a public hearing and shall publish notice once at least twenty (20) days and again ten (10) days prior to the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to adopt an ordinance that authorizes the sale to Inland Lakes Machine Inc. (the "Buyer") of real property owned by the City located in the City of Cadillac, Wexford County, Michigan and described as a portion of 326 Haynes Street to be determined by agreement of the City and the Buyer (the "Real Property"); and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk twice published a summary of the Ordinance in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Cadillac, together with a notice setting the time and place for a public hearing on the Ordinance, in accordance with the Charter. A copy of the Ordinance was and is available for examination at the office of the City Clerk, and copies may be provided for a reasonable charge; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing regarding the Ordinance was held on the $17^{\rm th}$ day of July, 2023, at 6:00 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, the sale of the Real Property to the Buyer as described in the Ordinance is in the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Cadillac, Wexford County, Michigan, resolves as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to Section 5.2 and 5.6 of the City Charter, the City adopts Ordinance No. 2023-06, Ordinance to Authorize Sale of Real Property (Portion of 326 Haynes Street) (the "Ordinance," attached as Exhibit 1).
- 2. The Mayor and the City Clerk are authorized to finalize a legal description of the Real Property, to execute any and all documents, and to take any and all actions, as may be necessary or appropriate to close upon the sale of the Real Property for a purchase price

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-06

ORDINANCE TO APPROVE SALE OF REAL PROPERTY (PORTION OF 326 HAYNES STREET)

THE CITY OF CADILLAC ORDAINS:

Section 1.

Pursuant to MCL 117.4e, the Charter of the City of Cadillac and other applicable authority, the City hereby approves the sale to the Inland Lakes Machine Inc. (the "Buyer") of real property owned by the City located in the City of Cadillac, Wexford County, Michigan and described as a portion of 326 Haynes Street as determined by agreement of the City and the Buyer (the "Real Property"). The description will be attached as Exhibit A when the determination is made. The sale agreement is attached to the resolution of the City Council adopting this Ordinance. The Mayor and the City Clerk in consultation with the City Attorney, are authorized to make non-material alterations to the final sale agreement.

Section 2.

The Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to finalize the legal description of the Real Property, to execute any and all documents and to take any and all actions necessary or appropriate to close upon the sale of the Real Property to the Buyer or its designee for a sale price of One Dollar and 00/100 (\$1.00) and a Ten Thousand Dollar and 00/100 (\$10,000) donation to the City to develop the adjacent micropark.

Section 3.

The City Clerk is directed, pursuant to Section 20-4(b) of the City's Code of Ordinances, within 30 days after the adoption of this ordinance, to record a certified copy of this ordinance with the Wexford County Register of Deeds and to send a copy to the State Treasurer.



RE: Water Well Cleaning

On July 11, 2023, the City held a bid opening on the above referenced project. This project includes pulling the well pump, casing, and screen, and then cleaning, disinfecting, inspecting the parts for any damage, and reinstalling all parts. This project will include maintenance on two production wells at the Crosby Road Well Field. The following bids were received:

On July 11, 2023, the City held a bid opening on the above referenced project. This project includes removal and restoration of doors and windows throughout the main building at the plant. Many of these are decades old. The following bid was received:

RE: Cadillac Community Center Painting

The FY2024 budget for the Cadillac Community Center (former Naval Reserve Center) includes an appropriation for repairing, restoring and painting the walls and ceiling in the main drill deck section of the facility as well as power washing and painting the exterior. This project will make a significant improvement to the appearance of the facility and is being led by Up North Arts as part of a larger-scale beautification project. When all is said and done, the grounds of the facility, especially on the North Side along Chestnut Street that is a highly visible area will undergo significant improvements. This will complement a number of other improvements that this group has made to the facility, primarily with funds they have raised and/or donated labor.

Up North Arts has done a significant amount of legwork to move this portion of the project forward. They have received significant grant funding and donations to cover many of the upgrades they are doing in conjunction with the painting, including a new sign, artwork in the North yard, and restoration of the historical insignias and emblems on the walls of the main drill deck.

As part of their work, they reached out to several painters over the last year, receiving varying quotes up to \$40,000 for the wall restoration, power washing, and paint work. After further discussion, the group determined that the best quote in terms of contractor reputation and price was from Jeff Campbell, a local painter with years of experience. City staff discussed with the group the process they used to secure quotes and are comfortable with the recommendation they made.

Recommended Action

It is recommended that competitive bidding be waived, and the Cadillac Community Center painting project be awarded to Jeff Campbell in the amount of \$36,500. Funds are available in the Naval Reserve Center Fund.
